Autumn Hall Wins Lower Cape Fear Stewardship Development Award Community Noted for “Significant Achievement”



Judges for the 2008 Lower Cape Fear Stewardship Development Award presented Autumn Hall with the distinction of “Significant Achievement,” acknowledging the developer’s efforts to preserve trees, mitigate storm water runoff and enhance public green space. “The plan is outstanding and environmentally responsible,” said one judge in written comments.

This is the fourth year the awards have been presented. Projects earning the Significant Achievement award are generally still in plan-stage or are in the development and construction process. The awards were presented on November 12, 2008, at the Burney Center on UNCW’s campus. Autumn Hall Developer Raiford Trask accepted the award on behalf of the entire development team, acknowledging the impact and influence of Autumn Hall’s engineers, land planners, landscape designers, arborist and others.
